- High rates of food insecurity and malnutrition, contributing to child mortality.

5. **Economic Instability**

- Rising food and energy prices.
- Impact of global factors such as conflicts in Ukraine affecting food imports.

Opportunities for ADHA Operations

- Government initiatives supporting economic and social development.
- Expansion of mineral resources, including gold and oil, to improve infrastructure and national revenue.
- Strengthened partnerships between NGOs and the government to align development efforts.
